

Road Names “The Oaks”



In keeping with the village theme and the historical context of the area, roads are named after wards and doctors of the former hospital. It is proposed that future road names continue to reflect this heritage. Specifically, names could be drawn from individuals who lived, worked, or were treated at the hospital.

The nearby memorial field contains 1,349 named burials in unmarked graves, dating from 1889 to 1956. As a respectful tribute to those individuals and to honour the site's history, it is

suggested that either first names or surnames from this record be considered for future road naming.

In addition to this, it is also recognised that there is a preference for incorporating natural themes in the naming of roads. This proposal supports the inclusion of names that align with that natural theme where appropriate, ensuring a balance between historical significance and the desired aesthetic of the development.

This approach would preserve a meaningful connection to the past while complementing the vision for a village-style community rooted in both heritage and nature.

Fred Clarke

Fred Clarke was the brother of science fiction writer Arthur C. Clarke, and he lived at Dene Court, a house located on Dene Road, passed on the way into Cotford St Luke. Dene Court served as the UK repository for Arthur Clarke's materials and was where his brother Fred resided.

Key facts:

Who he was: Frederick William "Fred" Clarke was the brother of the famous science fiction author Arthur C. Clarke.

Where he lived: He lived at Dene Court, a property located on Dene Road, between Cotford St Luke and Bishop's Lydeard, Somerset, England.

Dene Court's significance: Dene Court was used to house the UK archives of Arthur C. Clarke's work, acting as a repository for his legacy and materials.

Information from a resident:

"When I was a governor at Bishop Lydeard primary School, Fred Clarke opened the new extension to the School. I would often see Fred Clarke on Dene Road collecting litter on a regular basis which helped the up keep of the general appearance on the approach to Cotford St Luke.

In 1945, Arthur C Clarke published a paper outlining the concept of a network of satellites in geostationary orbit that that has relays for telecommunications. The orbit is now known as the Clarke orbit in his honour. We now know this as GPS."

Ellen Hamblin 1875-Jan 1856 was the last named person buried here. Aged 80 from Othery, worked as a barmaid.

An inquest was held at the Taunton Hospital on Friday afternoon, on the body of a young nurse named Mary Chilcott, 23 years of age, who was employed at the Somerset County Lunatic Asylum at Cotford, near Taunton, and who died in the Taunton and Somerset Hospital on Wednesday afternoon after having been discovered unconscious on the road near Dene Court, Bishop's Lydeard. Thomas Lock, a carter, of Preston, Milverton, described how when cycling from Bishop's Lydeard on the evening in question, and while going down Dene Court Hill he saw the deceased lying in the road on her face. Her bicycle was lying beside her. Witness stopped and went to her. Deceased was unconscious, and her forehead was injured. He went for Doctor Bunny, of Bishop's Lydeard. When the doctor arrived the deceased was taken in a carriage to Taunton Hospital. The only injury to the bicycle was the twisting of the handle bars. He saw nothing in the road which the deceased might have run over and which would have thrown her off. Francis Northcombe, plumber of Bishop's Lydeard, said that deceased was at his house on the evening in question, having come over to see his son, who was ill, and to whom she was engaged. She left at a quarter to ten, being due back at the Asylum at 10 o'clock. She had left quite as late before and had been over the same road several times. Dr. John Griffin, assistant house surgeon at the Hospital, said when the deceased was brought there she was quite unconscious, and died the next day. He had made a post-mortem examination. Witness then described the bruises the deceased had on her face, and stated there was a severe fracture of the skull. There were also two clots of blood pressing on the brain. Death was due to concussion of the brain, resulting from a fracture of the skull, which caused failure of the action of the heart.

Bio: He was born at Chard in 1876 and baptised at St Mary the Virgin Church, Chard, on the 7th of March 1876. He was the eldest son of Thomas Hawker (1843-1906), a Labourer, and Louisa Hawker nee Churchill (1845-1938), who were married on the 24th of February 1870 at St Mary's Church, Christon, North Somerset.

His only known sibling was George Hawker (b.1880) and the family resided at Ilminster Road, Chard. In 1881 the family had fallen upon hard times and Thomas and his younger brother; George, together with their Grandmother; Mary Hawker (b.1811) were recorded in the census records as being inmates of the Chard Union Workhouse.

In 1894, aged 18, Thomas enlisted into the Army, becoming Private 2983 in the 3rd Battalion of the Somerset Light Infantry. However, he was discharged in 1898 after being found to have contracted TB (Tuberculosis) and considered medically unfit for duty.

In 1900 he married Minnie Kate Lowman (1881-1941) of Knowle St Giles, Somerset, with whom he had 5 children.

The 1911 census records Thomas as residing with his wife and children in Chard and working as a Fish seller. He would make the 34 mile round-trip twice per week by horse and cart to collect fresh fish from Lyme Regis for re-sale in Chard.



It is unknown exactly when Thomas was admitted to the Cotford Asylum, nor whether it was for mental health reasons or to the section of the Asylum used as a Sanatorium for patients suffering from TB. However, given his previous medical history, the latter is most probable. He died in 1915 and was buried on the 3rd of March 1915. [Chapel of St Luke Burial Register].

Bio: He was born at Somerton, Somerset, in 1869 and baptised at St Michael and All Angels Church, Somerton, on the 28th March 1869. He was the son of Walter Mansfield (b.1827) of Curry Rivel, Somerset, a Labourer, and Tryphena Mansfield nee Webber (b.1831) of Ashill, Somerset, who were married at St Andrew's, Curry Rivel, on the 6th of August 1861.

At age 13 in 1881 Walter was recorded as being an Inmate of the Pauper's Children's Home at 1-2 Bridge Road Twerton, Bath, which was run by the Guardians of the Bath Poor Law Union Workhouse.

In 1888 he enlisted into the Army, serving as Private 6672 of the 3rd Battalion (Princess Victoria's) Royal Irish Fusiliers. He was deployed for a short while to South Africa during the second Boer War from the 14th of May 1900 until the 4th of December 1900. He was discharged from the Army in 1904 as being medically unfit having contracted TB.

After his time in the Army he then worked as a General Labourer until being admitted to the Cotford Sanatorium (date unknown). He died, aged 44, and was buried on 5th June 1914. (Chapel of St Luke Burial Register).

Bio: He was born at Mangotsfield, Nr Bristol, on the 3rd of February 1877 and was the son of Ebenezer John Heath (1842-1922) of Bristol and Annie Rich (1840-1903) of Mangotsfield, Gloucestershire, who were married at Bristol in 1864. His Father was a Butcher.

By 1881 the family had moved to reside at Clipston, nr Market Harborough, Northamptonshire, and by 1891 had moved again to reside in Islington, London.

In 1892 Samuel joined the Royal Navy as a 'Boy 2nd Class' (Service No.166547), giving his previous occupation as a Telegraph Messenger Boy. He served upon HMS Impregnable between 1892 and 1894, which was a Training Ship permanently moored off of Devonport, Plymouth. However, he was discharged from the Royal Navy in 1894 as being medically unfit, supposedly suffering from arthritis.

However, despite any medical condition this did not deter him from enlisting into the Army at Wells, Somerset, in 1897, becoming Private S/708 in the 3rd Company, 1st Battalion, of the Rifle Brigade (Prince Consort's Own). In 1899 his battalion was deployed to South Africa at the outbreak of the Second Boer War, seeing action at the Battle of Colenso in December 1899 and at the Battle of Vaal Krantz in February 1900. At the end of the war the 1st battalion left Cape Town aboard the SS Orissa, arriving at Southampton in late October 1902. After which he returned to Somerset and gained a position as an attendant at the Bath Pauper Lunatic Asylum at Horrington, near Wells (later called the Mendip Hospital).

On the 23rd of July 1906, at St John the Evangelist Church, East Horrington, Nr Wells, Somerset, he married Ada Alice Lodge (1885-1965).

Following the commencement of WW1 Samuel re-enlisted at Wells into his old Regiment during 1915, becoming Private 5434 (later renumbered as 10723) in the 6th Reserve Battalion of the Rifle Brigade (Prince Consort's Own). The Battalion was used for Home Service duties and were initially stationed at Sheerness, Kent, before going on in March 1916 to nearby Eastchurch, where it remained as part of Thames & Medway Garrison. It was during this time that Samuel was found to have contracted Tuberculosis (TB). He was admitted to the Cotford St Luke Sanatorium, where he succumbed to the disease on the 23rd of January 1918. His burial took place on the 28th of January 1918 (Chapel of St Luke Burial Register).

Muriel, the youngest, was born in 1894 when mother was 46. As she emerged from infancy we all noticed how often and how quickly she was emotionally and mentally upset. We were told to deal with this little sister lovingly and with forbearance, but she frequently complained that we neglected her - alas! it was true as far as it concerned me. As she grew she developed a hematic tendency and was recognised as difficult. In 1930 my dear mother, then 72, could not manage this untrained cross-patch of a daughter and asked Annie and myself if we could find some meter in Canada. We were living in Quebec where I was the rector of St. Peter's and had only one child. We agreed and a Canadian Pacific liner brought her over. The immigration authorities kept her in quarantine as a victim of dementia praecox and she never left the wharf. I saw her three times before she was sent back to England, where authorities confirmed Canada's diagnosis and, if I recall rightly, admitted some carelessness in the inspection of emigrants. She was taken immediately to the Somerset County Asylum where she existed passively for 14 years, dying at the age of 40. Of course, dear mother visited her regularly but I gather she met with little response, at least not in depth. [Edward Knowler Moffatt].
